#### 1. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

#### 2. COMPANY SECRETARY

On 5 February 2015 the Company appointed Mr Dean Scarparolo as Company Secretary and Financial Controller, following the resignation of Ms Lisa Wynne as Company Secretary.

#### 3. REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

During the period the Company focused on advancing its 100% owned projects in Sweden. Highlights include:

#### Project Development

- Vittangi project scoping study released targeting dual production of ~47,000tpa of combined graphite and graphene. Robust financial metrics demonstrated using conservative inputs;
- Test mining bulk sample permit application process completed;
- Talga appointed Independent Metallurgical Operations and Curtin University to expand the unique processing route for Vittangi graphite project mineralisation. Intensive metallurgical was conducted throughout the period; and
- Strong focus on opportunities in Germany. Commencement of graphene for conductive inks research program with Friedrich Schiller University Jena.

#### Exploration / Geology

- Major extensions of high grade Vittangi project graphite intersected in drilling north and south from resource area. New and parallel zones indicate potential for future resource growth. New ground secured at the Vittangi project to expand project strike length to 32km;
- Graphene produced from Jalkunen graphite project using Talga's one step process. Findings suggest Jalkunen originally part of the same geological unit hosting the Vittangi project - scale implications for graphene footprint in Sweden. New tenements secured to expand project strike length to 28km; and
- Promising cobalt-rich gold/copper drilling results from Kiskama 'IOCG' project.

#### Commercial

- Employment of full time commercial manager to reflect evolving status as emerging technology materials supplier;
- First sale of graphene to German Nano-to-3D printing technology company;
- Appointment of New York based EAS Advisors to broaden North American investor awareness;
- Formal broking relationship forged with Canaccord Genuity, a leading international mid market financial services firm; and
- Extensive international marketing and relationship building with graphite and graphene industry stakeholders.

#### **POST THE PERIOD**

Post the Christmas break management have been busy continuing end user dialogue as well as advancing research programs to effectively 'feed' end users with graphene data and application samples. The end of January 2015 saw Talga announce its commencement of a collaborative graphene and battery material research program with Dresden University of Technology and Max Planck Institute of Technology. Given Germany's proximity to Talga's Swedish assets, it's industrial appetite for graphite and graphene (which is predominantly imported from China) and its significant analytical and graphene research capabilities, Talga has made a concerted effort to focus its efforts in this jurisdiction. The aim is to develop a complete ore-to-product pathway to demonstrate Talga's graphene potential to the economic heart of Europe.

#### 4. CORPORATE

#### **General Meeting of Shareholders**

The Company hosted its 2014 Annual General Meeting on the 27<sup>th</sup> of November 2014, all resolutions were passed without amendment on a show of hands.

#### Issue of securities

During the period the Company received \$10,162 from the exercise of 29,034 listed options at an exercise price of \$0.35.

#### 1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

The financial report for the parent Talga Resources Ltd and its Controlled Entities, (The "Group") for the half-year ended 31 December 2014 was authorized for issue in accordance with a resolution of the directors on 11 March 2015. Talga Resources Ltd is a limited company incorporated in Australia and its shares are publicly traded on the Australian Securities Exchange.

The nature of the operations and principal activities of the Company are described on page 4 of this report.

#### 2. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The half-year financial report is a general-purpose financial statement, which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, applicable Accounting Standards including AASB 134 "Interim Financial Reporting" and other mandatory professional reporting requirements.

The half-year financial report has been prepared on a historical cost basis, except where applicable for financial assets that have been measured at fair value. For the purpose of preparing the half-year financial report, the half-year has been treated as a discrete reporting period.

The half year financial report does not include all notes of the type normally included within the annual financial report and therefore cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the Company as the full financial report.

The half year financial report should be read in conjunction with the annual Financial Report of Talga Resources Ltd as at 30 June 2014.

It is also recommended that the half year financial report be considered together with any public announcements made by Talga Resources Ltd during the half year ended 31 December 2014 in accordance with the continuous disclosure obligations arising under the Corporations Act 2001.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of the half year financial report are consistent with those adopted and disclosed in the Company's 2014 annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2014, except for the impact of the Standards and Interpretations described below. These accounting policies are consistent with Australian Accounting Standards and with International Financial Reporting Standards.

#### New and Revised Accounting Requirements Applicable to the Current Half-year Reporting Period

The Company has adopted all of the new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (the AASB) that are relevant to its operations and effective for the current reporting period. The application of the new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations does not have a material impact on the Group.

#### 8 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Other than as disclosed below, there has not been any other matter or circumstance occurring subsequent to the end of the period that has significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Group, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Group in future financial periods.

On 29 January 2015 the Company commenced its second advanced research program with German graphene application specialists. The new work comprises a joint graphene test program with Germany's Dresden University of Technology and the Max Planck Institute for Polymer Research. The 12 month program will test and demonstrate the Company's low cost bulk graphene product for supercapacitor and other battery related applications.

On 5 February 2015 the Company appointed Mr Dean Scarparolo as Company Secretary and Financial Controller, following the resignation of Ms Lisa Wynne as Company Secretary.

On 6 February 2015 the Company agreed to grant Caledonian Capital Ltd an option to purchase all of its Australian gold assets comprising Bullfinch, Mosquito Creek, Talga Talga and Warrawoona (collectively "the Projects"). The binding heads of agreement has been executed by both parties and a non-refundable \$50,000 deposit has been received. The option to purchase the Projects is subject to Caledonian being satisfied with its maximum three month due diligence and payment of a further non-refundable \$250,000. The exercise of the option and acquisition must be completed within 4 years at which point ownership of the Projects would transfer to Caledonian upon settlement of the remaining \$1,000,000 in cash. Talga retains 100% equity in the Projects until full acquisition and is due a 2.25% gross royalty payable on net smelter return of gold, diamonds and all other minerals extracted from the Projects during the Option period, and 1.5% in perpetuity thereafter.

#### 9 CONTINGENT LIABILITIES
